The Principle of Evaluation:
Romans 12:3 (NIV) "Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you."
The Principle of Cooperation:
Romans 12:4-5 (NLT) "Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ's body. We are all parts of his one body, and each of us has different work to do. And since we are all one body in Christ, we belong to each other, and each of us needs all the others."
Galatians 3:28 "In Christ there is no difference or division between Jews and Gentiles, free people and slaves, male or female. We are all one in Christ Jesus."
